# How to Help Young Catholics Stay Catholic, part 2



Last week I was saying how the way we act in church can encourage people, especially our young, to appreciate and be drawn to Jesus Christ, who is truly present in the Tabernacle. Where else, besides a Catholic church, can one actually walk on holy ground?

We cannot be a watered down version of ourselves if we hope to retain Catholics, because if the experience of our church is not unique in some way, there's no reason for people to give it their precious time. For example, if someone is drawn to attend baseball games, it's

not because people have tried to make baseball just like football or soccer. Baseball is unique; it is what it is, and that's what draws people to it. In the same way, we can't make the Church over in our image, according to our likes and habits. Yes, of course, the Church is always in need of purification so that even more it is what it is, the Body of Christ, but we assume first that Jesus Christ forms us through His Church, not that we form it and not that it has to accommodate itself to whatever we think is more important.

So it is vital that we not just believe that the bread and wine become the actual Body and Blood of our Lord and Savior, but that we let our actions proclaim this. We do this in many ways: fasting one hour (except for medicine and water) before Communion, not chewing gum in church, bowing as we step forward to receive the Eucharist, and not receiving the Eucharist if we've missed mass without good reason, without coming to Confession first. The Eucharist is not an absolute right; it is a privilege—no, not for the perfect, since Jesus Christ gradually perfects us through Himself in the Eucharist. We will never be completely worthy of it, but to treat it too casually says to others "This is not really so special or important," giving the message that there's nothing really unique about it and our entire Faith. The result is that people, especially the young, will think, "So then, why bother with it?"
